About DC's Mamie Johnson (MJLL) and Capitol Hill (CHLL) Little Leagues: MJLL is named in honor of DC resident and famed pitcher Mamie "Peanut" Johnson, who broke the gender barrier as the first female pitcher in professional baseball, with a 33-8 record playing for the Indianapolis Clowns in 1953-55. Founded in 2015, MJLL serves more than 230 players in Ward 7 and, last spring, made history as runner-up in the DC-wide Tournament. CHLL, founded in 2011, has grown from 120 to 550 baseball and softball players across Ward 6. Both leagues strive to make sure that all eligible youth softball and baseball players can play regardless of financial circumstances. To that end, they provide financial scholarships to cover registration fees and supply gloves, bats and other equipment. With quality playing fields in short supply, MJLL and CHLL also dedicate time and resources for field upkeep and repairs. The funds raised by this event could not come at a better time. Contributions will be split equally between these two non-profit, all-volunteer organizations, which are committed to the ideals of good sportsmanship, character, teamwork and respect.
